Please provide staffing requirements for the operations at BT1 listed below. Positions indicated below may not include all of the staffing requirements needed by each stevedore. It is the stevedore's responsibility to provide ALL staffing requirements to perform the indicated operations listed below. The Port operates all dockside equipment with the exception of the button man position for loading trucks.
 - Coke loading
Staffing per gang using ship's gear plus supervision and any other ancillary personnel.
Staffing per gang when Port operates shiploader plus supervision and any other ancillary personnel.
 - Calcine loading
Staffing per gang when Port operates shiploader/portable loading system plus supervision and any other ancillary personnel.

Staffing per gang using ship's gear plus supervision and any other ancillary personnel.
Staffing per gang when Port operates ship unloader/mobile harbor crane plus supervision and any other ancillary personnel.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT:

This Agreement for Stevedore Services is made and entered into as of the 1st day of January, 2017, by and between the **LAKE CHARLES HARBOR AND TERMINAL DISTRICT**, acting by and through Mr. William J. Rase III, Executive Director, duly authorized, hereinafter known as the "District"; and **FEDERAL MARINE TERMINALS, INC.**, an Illinois corporation, acting by and through its duly authorized representative, hereinafter known as the "Contractor".

W I T N E S S E T H:

THAT,

WHEREAS, the District is the owner and operator of a bulk handling marine terminal known as Bulk Terminal No. 1 (the "Facilities") at which various bulk cargoes are loaded and unloaded, stacked and stored for conveyance to or from a vessel or barge calling at the Facilities; and

WHEREAS, the District acts in the role as a "Port Captain" and, as such, undertakes to provide, through, and by direction to, Contractor, required appropriate vessel bulk loading and bulk unloading services to or from vessels which are calling at the Facilities on behalf of a number of different District customers; and

WHEREAS, upon the arrival of a vessel at the dock of the Facilities the District is supplied by the vessel with a loading or discharge plan to be followed in loading or unloading the vessel; and

WHEREAS, Contractor, for each vessel arrival, provides, in its discretion, the necessary supervision of the Contractor Labor utilized in loading or unloading any particular vessel to accomplish the vessel loading plan or vessel discharge plan; and

WHEREAS, once the loading or discharge plan obtained from the vessel is approved by the District, the District thereafter supplies through Contractor's onsite supervisory employee ("Supervisor") the loading or discharge plan to the Contractor and the Contractor thereafter, using Contractor employees ("Contractor Labor"), undertakes and implements the detailed activities necessary and appropriate to execute and accomplish the loading or discharge plan ("Labor Services" as further defined in Section 1.1 below); and

WHEREAS, Contractor Labor undertakes all necessary activities on the vessel, including the use of District owned equipment such as bull dozers or vessel owned equipment such as ship cranes, but excluding any activities carried out by District; and

WHEREAS, District employees operate, under the supervision of a District Supervisor and at the direction of the Contractor Labor on the vessel, bulk loading or unloading equipment,

such as a Ship loader device or Ship unloader crane, which are located on the dock forming part of the Facilities; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter stated, each party intending to be legally bound hereby, it is agreed as follows:

1. Services to be Provided by Contractor:

1.1 Contractor's Agreement to Provide Labor Services:

Upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, and in consideration of the safe, prompt and efficient performance by the Contractor of the covenants and agreements to be performed by the Contractor under this Agreement, the District contracts with Contractor to provide, only as it relates to bulk cargo, the following labor services in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein (the "Labor Services"). Contractor shall, in its discretion, provide such direct Contractor Labor as Contractor deems appropriate, to provide the necessary supervision and directing of the Labor Services. Further, Contractor will provide and be responsible for all Personal Protective Equipment ("PPE") and other safety equipment for Contractor Labor and Supervisor. Additionally, Contractor will supply all required Contractor Labor and Labor Services, in accordance with the Minimum Manning and Conditions set forth below, for the loading and unloading of ships and barges at the Facilities. The numbers and types of labor positions shall only

be in accordance with Minimum Manning and Conditions set forth below:

Minimum Manning and Conditions for the Labor Services to be Supplied by Contractor:

Ships: Two (2) flag men; and one walking foreman who will provide direction for the proper placement of the District's equipment into the hatch of vessels and for the operation of winches/cranes, ship loaders and ship un-loaders, for proper equipment movement, flagging, and performing other customary duties for the proper and safe loading and unloading of bulk cargo.

As to ships with Petroleum coke ("Pet coke"), coal, anode butts, barite, and commodities needing button men the District will order and Contractor will supply an additional man for ship work.

On a ship using ship's gear for bulk cargo operations, (not equipment movement such as dozers and bobcats), the District will, at its discretion, request Contractor to supply additional winch/crane operators.

Barges: Two (2) men to work lids on the barge, perform button man duties, and as needed, handle lines, tape lids, and perform all customary duties.

There shall be no requirement for the ordering or supplying of shovel men or sweepers on ships or barges unless requested by the ship or barge and approved by the District.

The District will order, at its discretion, and Contractor will supply tractor drivers, bobcat operators, shovel men, sweepers or other needed labor.

The District shall not pay Contractor any meal ticket charges. No Labor Services (longshoremen, tractor driver, clerk/timekeeper, and walking foreman) will be paid for by the District for any person who does not timely and actually appear at the Facility and stay and perform their assigned duties for the number of hours invoiced by Contractor to the District. Upon arrival at the Facility, each person performing Labor Services shall register with the District's foreman for the

particular operation for which the Labor Services are being supplied.

The District shall not be required to pay Contractor for any type or amount of pay including meal hour, overtime, double time, or any other pay other than as set forth in Exhibit "A".

The District will only pay those holiday per hour rates which correspond to the agreed shift times for the types of labor listed on Exhibit "A".

Guarantee time will be limited to 4 hours per call out for all classes of labor and no guarantee time will be paid after 4 hours of work per call out. However, if manning is sent to lunch [one (1) hour] during loading or unloading of ships or barges, then the District will pay a minimum of two (2) hours at the applicable shift differential regardless of the hours worked following the one (1) hour lunch period.

Further, if a complete required manning gang fails to timely report for work as requested by the District, the District shall not be required to pay minimum call out pay to the portion of the manning gang that does timely report for work, unless, in its sole discretion, the District elects to proceed with ship or barge operations with the labor that timely appeared.

Ordering times for weekends and holidays will be the same as any customary weekday order. Start times shall only be 0700, 1000, 1300, 1900 and 0100 each holiday or non-holiday day.

Clerk/Timekeeper:

For ships or barges, the District shall be obligated to pay only for a single clerk/timekeeper and only for 8 hours at the rate set forth in Exhibit "A". This one time call for 8 hours will be the only pay for a clerk/timekeeper for which the District is responsible for during the working of a ship or barge during its stay. There will be no meal hour adjustments, no guarantee time pay, or any other additional pay during the stay of any ship or barge.

In the case of lash barges and/or river barges, the District will pay an 8-hour clerk/timekeeper (8 hours per 24 hours of continuous work) per commodity, at the rates set forth in Exhibit "A" that is in effect at the start time of a barge operation. This one time call for 8 hours will be the only pay the District is responsible for during the working of that operation during that 24-hour period. There will be no meal hour adjustments, no guarantee time pay, or any other additional pay during this 24-hour period.

Contractor shall be responsible for contacting the District on a daily basis to determine the timing and scope of the required Labor Services and Contractor Labor and will provide the Labor Services as requested by the District. The Labor Services supplied by Contractor shall be supplied at the request of the District; however, Contractor shall supply the control and supervision of the Labor Services and Contractor Labor is responsible for insuring that cargoes are properly loaded and stowed into ships and barges or that cargoes are properly off-loaded from ships or barges, per the instructions provided by the District in the District's capacity as Port Captain.

1.2 Rates and Charges: During the term of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide the Labor Services only for bulk cargo at the minimum hourly rates (per hour rates or holiday per hour rates as applicable) in accordance with the Minimum Manning and Conditions for the various types of bulk cargoes handled at the Facilities. Contractor will be paid by the District on a per ship or per barge basis within thirty (30) days of receipt of proper and detailed invoicing by Contractor at the above hourly rates, together with an amount equal to 6.0% of such hourly rates. The District shall not be responsible or liable for any other charges or expenses than those set forth in this paragraph 1.2.

1.3 Compliance with Laws: Contractor shall, in supplying the Labor Services and Contractor Labor contemplated herein, at all times comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, or regulations.

2. Term: The term of this Agreement shall be twelve (12) months beginning on January 1, 2017. Thereafter, this Agreement shall continue on a month-to-month basis unless cancelled by either party upon the giving of thirty (30) days written cancellation notice to the other party.

2.1. Contractor to Gain Efficiencies; Benefit to the District: During the term of this Agreement or any extension of it, Contractor agrees to seek ways to reduce manning requirements and hourly labor rate costs and to seek any other efficiencies or reductions in cost which may be possible. If such efficiencies are achieved or if any costs are reduced, Contractor agrees to notify the District of such efficiencies or cost reductions and immediately adjust the Labor Services supplied and costs provided to be paid Contractor on Exhibit "A".

3. Responsibility for Loss or Damage; Indemnification; Care, Custody and Control:

3.1. Contractor's General Agreement to Indemnify. The Contractor releases the District, its officers, representatives, employees, agents, successors, and assigns, (individually and collectively, "District Indemnatee") from, assumes any and all

liability for, and agrees to indemnify the District Indemnatee against all claims, liabilities, obligations, damages, penalties, litigation, costs, charges, and expenses (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees and the costs and expenses of appellate action, if any), for both personal injury of any person and property loss of any property, imposed on, incurred by, or asserted against the District arising out of: (i) any claim connected with the negligent provision by the Contractor of Labor Services or Contractor Labor or other negligent actions or inactions by the Contractor associated with this Agreement, or (ii) any claim arising out of the negligent use or occupancy of District owned facilities or property, or (iii) any negligent activities on or about District owned property or facilities by Contractor, its officers, representatives, agents, or employees, of any nature, whether foreseen or unforeseen, ordinary or extraordinary, in connection with the negligent use or occupancy of District owned property or facilities by the Contractor, its officers, representatives, employees, agents, successors, and assigns, provided, however, that to the extent any such claim, liability, obligation, damage, or penalty arising as a result of the negligence or willful misconduct of the District shall be excluded from this release and indemnity. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Contractor shall not be responsible for any shortage of cargo except to the extent such is caused by Contractor, its employees or agents' negligence or willful misconduct.

Additionally, any property damage caused to any cargo handled by Contractor as a result of the defective condition of the property or facilities of the District, or for shortage of cargo where such is not caused by Contractor, its employees or agents' negligence or willful misconduct, shall be excluded from this release and indemnity. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, the Contractor's obligations under this Section 3.1 shall in no event exceed the greater of (A) \$5,000,000.00 or (B) the total insurance proceeds paid by the Contractor's insurers in settlement or satisfaction of the claims under this Section 3.1. However, the indemnity provided in this section shall not include any claims, liabilities, obligations, damages, penalties, litigation costs, charges, and expenses (including without limitation attorneys' fees and the costs and expense of appellate action, if any) to the extent such is caused by the negligent action or inaction of the District

3.2. Survival of Indemnities: The foregoing indemnities and agreements shall survive the term of this Agreement and shall be in addition to any obligations of the indemnifying party for breach of any term or condition of this Agreement.

4. Insurance:

4.1. Public Liability: Contractor agrees to carry or cause to be carried public liability insurance with respect to its activities and liabilities arising under this Agreement in the minimum combined single limit amount of Five Million dollars

(\$5,000,000) for the death of or personal injury to one or more persons and for property damage for each occurrence in connection with the Contractor's activities and liabilities arising under this Agreement, and same shall include the District as an additional insured with respect to any liability exposure of the District by virtue of its ownership of the properties upon which Contractor shall conduct its activities, or of any activities of the District which are required or permitted hereunder. Such insurance policy shall contain a provision or be accompanied by a certificate or endorsement to the effect that the insurance company shall not cancel or materially modify such policy without first giving written notice thereof to the District at least thirty (30) days in advance of such cancellation to material modification. At the District's request, Contractor shall promptly provide to District certificates evidencing such insurance and shall furnish copies of such policies to the District.

4.2. Workers' Compensation or Longshoremen Harbor Workers Act Benefits: Contractor further covenants and agrees, at its expense, to take out and maintain at all times, all necessary workers' compensation or longshoremen harbor workers act insurance covering all persons employed by Contractor to the extent required by applicable laws.

4.3. Qualification for Insurer: All insurance policies required above shall be issued by companies authorized to do

business within the State of Louisiana, and be rated no less than "B" as to management, and no less than "Class V" as to financial strength by the latest edition of Best's Insurance Guide, published by A. M. Best Company, Oldwick, New Jersey, or an equivalent rating agency, subject to the approval of the District.

5. Notices:

5.1. Addresses: All notices, demands, and requests which may or are required to be given hereunder shall be in writing, delivered by personal service, or shall be sent by facsimile, United States registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the parties at the following numbers and addresses:

or to such other numbers or addresses as either party may from time to time designate by written notice to the other party hereto at least fifteen (15) days in advance of an effective date stated therein.

6. Force Majeure: Either party hereto shall be excused from performing any of its respective obligations or undertakings provided in this Agreement, for so long as the performance of such obligations or undertakings are prevented or significantly delayed, retarded, or hindered by acts including Acts of God, government restrictions, riots, civil commotions, wars, insurrections, acts of terrorism, strikes, lockouts, floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, tropical storms, labor shortages, whether actual or threatened, or any other cause similar to those enumerated, beyond such party's reasonable control. The affected party shall give the other party prompt written notice, with full details following the occurrence of the cause relied upon. If it is reasonably possible to provide such assurance, within five (5) business days after written request by the other party, the affected party will provide adequate assurances that the delay will not exceed 30 days. If the affected party does not provide those assurances, or if the delay exceeds 30 days, the other party may terminate the Agreement by notice given to the affected party before performance resumes.

7. Successors: The covenants, agreements, terms, provisions, and conditions contained in this Agreement shall apply to and inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the District and the Contractor and their respective successors and assigns, except as expressly otherwise herein provided, and shall be deemed

covenants running with the respective interests of the parties hereto.

8. Surviving Covenants: Each provision of this Agreement which may require performance in any respect by or on behalf of either the Contractor or the District after the expiration of the term hereof or its earlier termination shall survive such expiration or earlier termination.

9. Provisions Deemed Conditions and Covenants: All of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed and construed to be "conditions" and "covenants" as though the words specifically expressing or importing covenants and conditions were used to each separate provision hereof.

10. Headings: The headings and section captions in this Agreement are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent of this Agreement or in any way affect this Agreement as to matters of interpretation or otherwise.

11. No Oral Change or Termination: This Agreement and the exhibits appended hereto, if any, and incorporated herein by reference contain the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, supersedes any prior agreements or understandings between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no change, modification, or discharge hereof in whole or in part shall be effective unless such change,

modification, or discharge is in writing and signed by both parties, including the party against whom enforcement of the change, modification, or discharge is sought. This Agreement cannot be changed or terminated orally.

12. Governing Law; Severability: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana. If any term or provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

13. Waiver of Venue: The parties irrevocably waive any objections which they may have now or hereafter to (a) the personal or subject matter jurisdiction of the federal or state courts in the state of Louisiana, (b) the venue of any proceedings brought in such court, or (c) that such proceedings have been brought in a non-convenient forum when brought in such court. The parties irrevocably agree that any final judgment (after appeal or expiration of time for appeal) entered by such court shall be conclusive and binding upon the parties and may be enforced in the

courts of any other jurisdiction to the fullest extent permitted by law.

14. Counterparts: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which so executed shall be deemed to be an original and all of which together shall constitute but a single document.

15. Gender of Words: Words of any gender in this Agreement shall be held to include masculine or feminine and words denoting a singular number shall be held to include the plural, and plural shall include the singular, whenever the sense requires.

16. Sovereign Immunity; Statutory Authority: The District represents and warrants that it has the statutory authority to enter into this Agreement, that, when executed, this Agreement shall be binding and enforceable in accordance with its terms, and that it is not immune from suit or judgment resulting from any claim or action brought against it by the Contractor pursuant to the express terms of this Agreement.

17. Legal Relationships: This Agreement shall not be interpreted or construed as establishing a partnership or joint venture or Principal/Agency relationship between the District and the Contractor and neither party shall have the right to make any representations or be liable for the debts or obligations of the other. Neither party is executing this Agreement as an agent for an undisclosed principal. No third party is intended to be benefited

by this Agreement. Contractor shall at all times be deemed to be an independent contractor and not the agent of the District.

18. Audits:

(A) Contractor shall maintain complete and accurate records at its Lake Charles office or other Contractor location with regard to all Labor Services provided under this Agreement. Contractor shall retain such records for a period of three (3) years from the date on which the records are generated. Contractor shall afford to the Legislative Auditor and/or the District's internal or external auditors at reasonable times access to all records and facilities necessary to permit evaluation and audit and verification of the performance of all requirements of this Agreement. This access shall include inspection and reproduction of any and all information deemed necessary by the Legislative Auditor and/or the District's internal or external auditors to support any billings or charges by Contractor but shall not include financial statements of Contractor. If the District retains outside auditors for this purpose and these auditors report discrepancies in the information which exceed five (5%) percent on an annual basis and which would have caused the District to be over billed, then Contractor shall promptly pay to the District on demand any over payment, as well as the cost of such an audit. If the deficiency is less than five (5%) percent or the auditor's report that the District has underpaid amounts due Contractor,

then the District shall pay the cost of the audit and the District shall promptly repay to Contractor any underpayment which may be due Contractor.

(B) Contractor shall afford access to all records pursuant to the provisions of this section during the term of this Agreement or any extension and for a period of three (3) years after termination of this Agreement, or longer if required by law.

(C) The District agrees not to release any information or documents which it obtains under this section unless in compliance with applicable laws.

19. Compliance with Tariff: It is agreed between the parties that Contractor will observe and obey all of the rules, regulations, and charges governed by the District's Tariff 013, as supplemented and amended from time to time including, but not limited to, providing all of its Contractor Labor the necessary and proper PPE.

20. Prior Agreements: With respect to the matters contained herein, this Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes, except as provided for herein, all prior agreements.

It is further understood by the parties hereto that this Agreement pertains to the handling of bulk cargo only and the District is allowed to arrange for other stevedoring companies to handle other kinds of cargo at the Facilities.


